

## **How to become a Referee**

The TSA will begin to post Referee Clinics in the month of January on their website of <http://www.refcentre.com/ontario/>. Please register for one of the clinics.

**PLEASE NOTE THAT REGISTRATION IS NOT COMPLETE UNTIL PAYMENT IS MADE IN FULL. YOU MUST REGISTER AT *REFCENTRE* 10 DAYS BEFORE**

### **THE CLINIC YOU WISH TO ATTEND**

1. You must be 14 years of age as of March 31, 2017.
2. Attend an Entry Level Clinic – hosted by clubs in the Ontario Soccer Association – successfully pass the Laws of the Game Test that is part of the Entry Level Clinic.
3. The clinics are normally done on weekends for two 9 hour sessions and then your final exam. You must complete and successfully pass in order to be awarded the Certificate.
4. The maximum number of students for each classroom clinic is 25. As the spots are limited it is in your best interest to book as early as you can.
5. Attend the clinic – be at the clinic 15 minutes before the start time and be dressed for physical activity. Bring a pen and paper.
6. Complete the online exam by the deadline date assigned by the clinic instructor.
7. After successful completion of the course, including a passing mark on the exam, you will be registered as an OSA official. You will also be registered as a referee.

Once you have completed the 2day course and have officially received your Referee Certificate.
